





We hosted 2 community conversations about the future of the Third Precinct – one was held on Zoom, the other, inperson. City staff and elected officials came and answered questions and provided what information they had available. Input from residents and this engagement effort was critical to the resolution passed unanimously by City Council, which allocated \$100,000 to dedicated Third Precinct site location engagement by the City



What are the top 3 things LCC should focus on in 2022?


